Community Management Summary – 16.3.25

Participants: Ilana Peleg, Erez Peled, Talia Arad, Yifat Segal, Ishai Levi, Maor Persai, Shlomo Levy, Limor Griman .

1 .Proposal for management and handling of personal budget deviations .

The proposal presented by Maor and Limor was based on a 2009 Mazkirut decision and has been updated.

During the discussion, we clarified certain sections within the proposal .

Additionally, it was suggested to impose sanctions in three areas for those with significant debts:

- Moving to a permanent home
- Entering long-term studies
- Taking a sabbatical year

After the changes, the proposal was approved and will be submitted for approval at the upcoming asefa. (See next item). **Note: The Community Management goals for 2025** - the discussion was postponed until the next meeting.

To be discussed at the Asefa:

Procedure for Handling Members' Overdrafts in their Allowances.

Members of the kibbutz are allowed to exceed their budgets by up to three monthly budgets.

1. Handling exceptional budgets is the responsibility of a team that includes the secretary and the financial manager.

2. A member planning a special financial expenditure should contact the financial manager in advance to obtain credit and arrange a repayment plan.

3. Budget holders who are not members or children of the kibbutz have no right to exceed their budget. Descendants in the younger generation are subject to the younger generation decision appendix. (Parents are responsible for their children's debt – Ed)

4. A member whose excess exceeds three budgets will be summoned for a discussion with the budget team, and one or more of the following measures will be implemented according to their spending patterns:

a. They will not be eligible to order a vehicle, except for special events with written approval from the secretary.

b. Cancellation of the "Dor Alon" fuel card.

c. Financial restrictions on cash withdrawals, spending in the shop, and reduced credit card limits.

d. Transfer of funds to the budgets of other members or external accounts will not be permitted.

5. The allowable expenditure amount through all the above measures will not exceed 60% of the personal budget.

6. These restrictions will remain in effect until the entire debt is paid (including the three-month allowed debt previously allowed – Ed).

7. If, after two months from the implementation of the restrictions, there is no improvement, the member will be invited to an extended team meeting that includes

the head of the members' committee (Merakez Va'adat Chaverim, Mazkir, Finance Manager. The team may take one or more of the following actions:

a. Cancellation of the credit card.

b. Cancellation of the option to use vehicles from the kibbutz fleet.

c. Closure of the budget in the kolbo and in additional places in the kibbutz.

8. In the case of a debt in the budget exceeding №100,000:

a. Their eligibility to submit a request for permanent housing will be frozen. If the member has already submitted a request and has been allocated a permanent apartment but is found to be exceeding by more than №100,000, their eligibility to begin the construction/renovation process will be revoked.

b. Their right to begin long-term studies funded by the education committee will be revoked.

c. Consideration will be given to revoking the right to take a year off.

9. Conditions for debt settlement with a member - the financial manager may grant loans to members for only two purposes: debt settlement or construction.

a. Maximum loan amount - №100,000.

b. Maximum repayment period for the loan - up to 10 years.

c. Interest on the loan will be at the prime rate.

d. A member requesting to repay a loan or part of it before its due date may do so without fines or restrictions.

10. The Community Management may change this procedure from time to time.



From the Dental Clinic – Mouthwash

I'd like to share a little tip ahead of the holiday regarding mouthwash. Many ask me if mouthwash is necessary, and the answer is yes. I recommend rinsing as an addition to maintaining oral health. The benefits include:

-Freshening the mouth – Provides an immediate feeling of freshness.

-Reducing bacterial plaque – There are specific rinses that inhibit plaque accumulation.

-Strengthening enamel – Mouthwashes containing fluoride help prevent cavities, especially in children.

-After surgical treatment – A rinse containing chlorhexidine as advised by the doctor.

It's important to remember:

*Mouthwash is not a substitute for brushing teeth and cleaning between them with aids.

*You can choose a mouthwash in consultation with the dental hygienist or dentist.

Updated Criteria Table and Procedures for Sabbatical Year

We want to inform you on two important updates regarding the committee's activities:

2. Changes in the Criteria Table for Long-Term Studies:

Over the past year, we have invested significant effort in refining the criteria table to improve the selection process for students. The new table allows us to review all applications in a comprehensive and as objective a manner as possible, and to prioritise them in a thoughtful and unbiased way. (Both the previous and the new tables are attached in the Hebrew Alon – Ed). The new table is also available in the Higher Education Committee files on Kehilanet. It is important to note that if a study request is not approved, any member may request their personal criteria table to understand the considerations that led to the decision and to try to improve their chances next time.

2. Update on Committee Procedures for Teachers Requesting a Sabbatical Year:

A detailed update regarding the committee's procedures for teachers taking a sabbatical year is attached. We place great importance on taking a sabbatical year for rest and renewal, a right reserved only for teachers. However, we must operate within the defined budget.

The updated criteria table and the procedural update regarding the sabbatical year have been discussed and approved by the H.R. management. For any questions or concerns, you can always reach out to Higher Education committee members.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank each member of the committee for their care, contribution, and investment: Peter Pezaro, Philippa Segal, Rotem Agmon, Natalie Zinenko, Revital Zelas, and Alita Mor. Special thanks to Momi for his behindthe-scenes assistance with the monthly responsibilities.

- A sabbatical is a right reserved for teachers, and a teacher is entitled to take a sabbatical once every seven years, provided they have worked full-time and have accumulated sufficient funds in the Ministry of Education fund for their living expenses and studies.

- In addition to the Education Committee and the Ministry of Education, requests for a sabbatical year should also be directed to the Reserve Fund to ensure there are sufficient funds and to receive approval for the sabbatical.

- Teachers in part-time positions (not 100%) require approval from H.R.

- A teacher planning to take a sabbatical must submit a formal request to the Higher Education Committee during February-March, including all components of the request (e.g., attending one-year courses, half sabbatical, studies lasting more than a year, etc.).

- If the teacher is pursuing a master's degree that lasts more than one year, this should be indicated in the request to the committee (half sabbatical or sabbatical + year of studies with a part-time position).

- Upon taking a sabbatical, a reimbursement will be provided according to the cap of the professional development fund. Any training or studies costing more will be at the teacher's expense or with special approval from H.R. (e.g., a master's degree).

- During this year, the teacher's grant (which replaces a monthly salary) will be returned to the Reserve Fund.

- During this year, the teacher will be subject to the Higher Education Committee and may request reimbursements for study-related expenses and travel (a vehicle may not be used at the expense of outside work).

- Studies will not be approved for teachers outside the sabbatical framework (e.g., taking a sabbatical and then studying two years later).

Health Tips from Environmental Quality Committee

Here are some tips for maintaining health and environmental quality, this time focusing on kitchen utensils.

Plastic utensils are widely available and convenient to use. The problem is that plastic is made from fossil fuels, a process that contributes to pollution and climate change. Additionally, plastic decomposes very slowly and can remain in landfills and oceans for hundreds of years, releasing toxins and harming wildlife in the process. Furthermore, some types of plastic may release harmful chemicals into food, especially when exposed to heat.

The solution: Make informed choices by using utensils made from natural and environmentally friendly materials.

- Wood: A great option for cutting boards, cooking spoons, and knife handles. It is strong, beautiful, pleasant to touch, and environmentally friendly. When sourced from sustainably managed forests, wood is a renewable resource that naturally decomposes at the end of its life without harming the environment.

- Glass: A natural material that can replace plastic. It is also fully and indefinitely recyclable, making it a greener choice.

- Cleaning Brushes: Available in versions made from natural materials. Brushes made from coconut fibers or bamboo decompose naturally at the end of their life without leaving toxins or microplastics in the environment.

The cooking utensils we use also affect our health and the environment.

Healthier cooking materials for us and the environment: Glass, stainless steel, cast iron (enamel-coated without lead), and ceramics.

Cooking materials to avoid:

- Teflon: A common coating on cookware. However, studies show that Teflon can break down at high temperatures, releasing toxic substances that can harm health.

- Aluminum: Aluminum can react with acidic foods and release toxic substances. It is recommended to avoid cookware made from aluminum (especially those that are uncoated), **as well as aluminum foil!**

- Cadmium and Lead: These are highly toxic materials that may be found in old or cheap cookware. It is important to ensure that the cookware you purchase does not contain cadmium or lead. **Health effects of toxic materials in cookware:** Prolonged exposure to toxic substances in cookware can lead to various health issues. Teflon, for example, contains a chemical called PFOA that has been linked to cancer, fertility problems, heart disease, and thyroid dysfunction. Aluminum can accumulate in the body and is associated with degenerative diseases like Alzheimer's and Parkinson's. Cadmium and lead are toxic metals that can harm the nervous system, kidneys, and other body systems.

How to take care of our cookware:

* Do not use damaged or scratched cookware, as this can lead to the release of toxic substances into food.

* Avoid overheating cookware, especially those with coatings. Overheating can release toxic substances and damage the coating.

* Use safe utensils for mixing and serving, such as wooden or silicone utensils, instead of metal ones that can scratch the coating.

* Easier cleaning – many healthy cookware options, like stainless steel and glass, are easier to clean than those with special coatings. Wash them thoroughly with warm water and soap after each use.

High-quality pots can be ordered from these companies:

- **Stainless Steel Pots: AllClad, Calphalon, Lodge
- Cast Iron Pots: Lodge
- Glass Pots: Pyrex
- -High-Temperature Resistant Ceramic Cookware: Xtrema

The (Almost) Back Page

On Tuesday evening, following the announcement of the decision to fire Shin Bet chief Ronen Bar, an emergency demonstration was held at the Habima Theatre Plaza. The demonstration was led by the Defensive Shield Forum - former heads of the security establishment and their counterparts in the police, moderated by Noam Tibon. The speakers: Tamir Pardo, Roni Alsheikh, Yoram Cohen, Rafi Ben-Shitrit and Einav Tzangauker.

Reut Shaliv, who was present at the protest, asked Rafi Ben-Shitrit if he could send her his text and he agreed: Here is the text:

רס"ד (With the help of God)

I came here tonight from Beit Shean not only as a concerned citizen and not just as a bereaved father... I came here tonight because there are moments when reality calls you to go, as the poet Hanna Senesh, the paratrooper who never returned, said:

At the Crossroads

"A voice called and I went. I went, for it called I went lest I fall. At the crossroads I blocked both ears with white frost and cried for what I lost. (Hannah Senesh, Caesarea 12.1942)

On October 7th, we lost our beloved son, Sergeant Elroi Ben-Shitrit, a fighter in the Combat Reconnaissance Battalion who fought with his fellow fighters with courage and heroism in the Nahal Oz camp and fell defending the homeland and the freedom of Israel.

I came here to read with you the call for what we believe should be self-evident: **To establish a judicial commission of enquiry to investigate the October 7th disaster**, to investigate in depth and thoroughly, all ranks, at all levels. A state investigation committee that will do justice to the fallen, will bring some peace to the families and security to future generations. The enormous failure of the October 7th is on a scale we have not known since the establishment of the state. The failure, and with it the grief, cry out to the heavens.

There is enough blame for everyone. But there is only one who stood at the helm and should have been the first to recognise the responsibility that he himself bears. The

duty to bow his head and ask for forgiveness. We did not imagine that those to be investigated would expect to appoint their own investigators. We did not imagine that the interrogated could fire his interrogators.

How will we fix it if we do not know how we messed up? How will we improve if we do not know what we have failed at? How will we heal if we do not know what we have suffered? Therefore, a state investigation committee will define the field of discourse, will serve as a compass and conscience for moral leaders who are honest and have clean hands. The conclusions of the state investigation committee will serve as a guide for any future leader.

The head of Shin Bet took responsibility and declared that he would resign when the last of the kidnapped people return. He was also the one who said publicly that a state investigation committee should be established. The Shin Bet is also the body investigating the suspicions of involvement of members of Netanyahu's office with the Qatari government.

Firing the investigators, those who take responsibility and those who support a state investigation committee is a political act and we will not let it happen!

Ronen Bar will go home, he promised. He will complete his work and go home, together with everyone who bears responsibility for the 7th of October disaster. But not for political reasons, for reasons of taking responsibility after the end of the war and the return home of our kidnapped people.

Our mission is first and foremost to work to return all the hostages! The living to the families and the fallen to their final resting places. We cannot begin the work of rebuilding and uniting Israeli society without returning all our brothers and sisters from the hell of Gaza. The enemy must be subdued and destroyed, but before that, **return all the hostages! Now!**

After their return and with the establishment of the State Commission of Inquiry, the work of healing all social and political ills and afflictions will begin. Then, and only then, can the restoration of social solidarity, a return to our most basic values of mutual responsibility, social justice, the redemption of captives, human freedom, the sanctity of life, everything that was sacred in our eyes and faded over the years, happen. To return again and become a model society founded on the vision of the prophets of Israel, and the thinkers and founders of the Zionist enterprise.

All my life I was raised and educated to love the land, to love the state and to be willing to sacrifice for it. My son, Elroi, chose to serve in the Combat Battalion at the Nahal Oz base. He was aware of the dangers and chose meaningful service from the same values we instilled in him. Elroi, who was born on Passover, fell on Simchat Torah. He lived 20 years between these two holidays that symbolise more than anything the secret of our existence and the secret of our eternity.

Loyalty to the people, to the Torah, and to the land are what show us the way. Loyalty to the state comes before loyalty to one or another prime minister.

The citizens come before the government.

The kingdom comes before the king.

Democracy comes before politics.

In these formative historical times, from the depth of the rift and the magnitude of the pain, I would like to offer hope today.

Replace the infamous three hands of power, money, and honour with 3 thousand.

Love - because it is the basis of every human connection. Love is what motivates us in difficult times... We need unconditional love, more than ever.
